

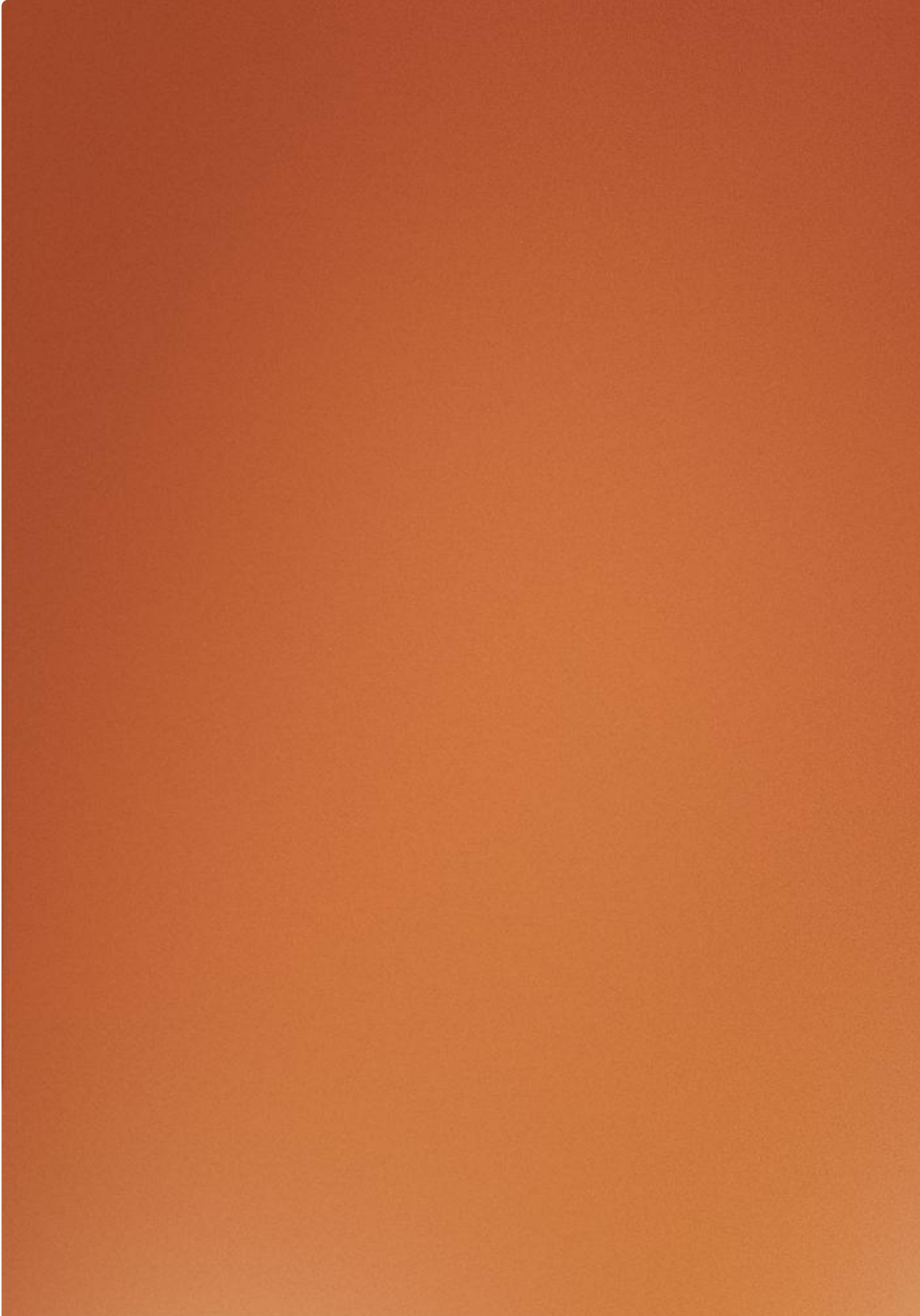


Civil War (2024)

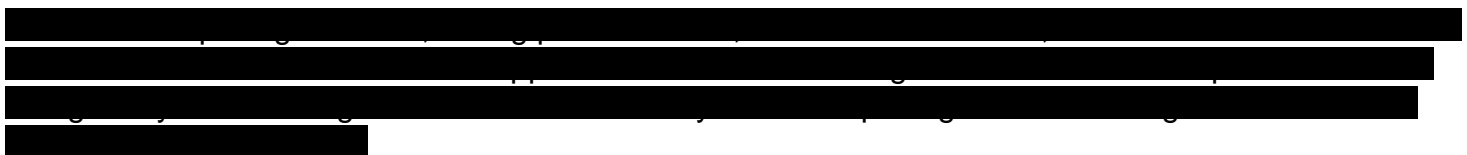
