### A Suspense-Thriller That Drops the Ball

“Crumb Catcher” follows newlyweds Shane (Rigo Garay) and Leah (Ella Rae Peck) as they navigate a chaotic honeymoon filled with dubious characters and sinister undertones. What starts as an awkward post-wedding photo session spirals into a [psychological thriller](#) when a creepy waiter named John (John Speridakos) and his wife Rosie (Lorraine Farris) disrupt their retreat with a blackmail scheme that threatens to unravel Shane’s secrets and their fragile marriage.



Chris Skotchdopole's debut feature attempts to blend absurdist suspense with psychological drama. Unfortunately, the film's direction is uneven, often veering into melodrama without delivering the necessary tension. The woozy, disorienting camera work and the rapid shifts in tone leave viewers more confused than intrigued.

Rigo Garay and Ella Rae Peck struggle to bring chemistry to their roles as Shane and Leah. Garay's portrayal of Shane as a nervous, wide-eyed author feels disconnected from Peck's manipulative, power-broker Leah. John Speridakos as the overbearing and obnoxious John provides some moments of cringe-worthy intensity, but the performances overall lack cohesion and depth.

The screenplay, penned by Skotchdopole, is a jumble of half-baked ideas and underdeveloped subplots. The dialogue is clunky and often forced, failing to create believable interactions between characters. The narrative relies heavily on absurd plot twists and contrived scenarios that undermine the film's potential for genuine suspense.

The film's visuals oscillate between chaotic, fractal imagery and overly stylized compositions that feel out of place. The editing is similarly exaggerated, with unnecessary flashbacks and rapid cuts that disrupt the flow of the story. While the intention may have been to create an unsettling atmosphere, the execution falls flat.

The soundtrack tries to heighten the tension with a mix of eerie soundscapes and dramatic scores. However, the music often feels out of sync with the film's tone, further contributing to the overall disjointed experience.

Crumb Catcher touches on themes of love, betrayal, and the racial optics of power dynamics, but these themes are explored superficially. The film gestures at deeper societal critiques without fully engaging with them, leaving viewers with more questions than answers.

The film's strengths lie in its ambition to tackle complex themes and its attempt to create an unsettling atmosphere. However, its weaknesses are numerous: disjointed direction, lackluster performances, a convoluted screenplay, and inconsistent visuals. Compared to psychological thrillers like Gone Girl or Get Out, Crumb Catcher fails to deliver the same level of intrigue and engagement.

Crumb Catcher is a film that promises suspense but delivers confusion.
