

Hellboy: The Crooked Man (2024)

Movie Review

"Hellboy: The Crooked Man" marks a new chapter in the Hellboy franchise, directed by Brian Taylor and starring Jack Kesy as the titular character. away much of the fantastical spectacle seen in previous Hellboy movies, opting instead for a more grounded, intimate folk-horror experience.




