



Hollywoodgate (2024)

Description

"Hollywoodgate" culminates in a terrifying display of the American weaponry now in Taliban hands, a sequence that feels both surreal and alarmingly real. This scene, among others, serves as a potent reminder of the unintended consequences of international military actions.

The documentary is a powerful example of cinematic journalism, filling the gaps left by traditional news coverage. It offers a sobering look at a country in flux, highlighting the dire situation for its citizens, especially women, and the potential global repercussions.
