



National Anthem (2024)


Description

In 2020, photographer Luke Gilford released "National Anthem," a monograph <u>capturing</u> the vibrant queer <u>community</u> within the International Gay Rodeo Association (IGRA). The photographs are striking and <u>beautiful</u>, reflecting Gilford's <u>deep connection</u> to the Southwest and his childhood <u>love</u> for rodeos. The story follows Dylan, who, after struggling to support his family as the de facto father figure to his younger brother, finds an opportunity to work at a local ranch. Here, he is welcomed into a close-knit community of queer ranchers and rodeo performers who embrace their identities and celebrate their differences. As Dylan becomes more involved in this world, he begins to explore his own identity and desires, ultimately discovering what it means to truly belong.

Visually, "National Anthem" captures the <u>stunning landscapes</u> of New Mexico, using the natural beauty of the region to enhance the emotional depth of the narrative. The cinematography is both vibrant and intimate, <u>allowing viewers</u> to connect with the characters and their experiences. Critics have praised the film for its authentic portrayal of queer culture and the warmth of the community it depicts.

Charlie Plummer delivers a heartfelt performance as Dylan, embodying the character's struggles and growth with sincerity. Mixed to Negative Aspects

into atmosphere at the expense of a more developed narrative. This can make the <u>film feel</u>

2. Reliance on Tropes:

The film has been criticized for leaning into unfortunate tropes, which can undermine its
originality and impact. This reliance on <u>familiar elements</u> may detract from the film's overall
