

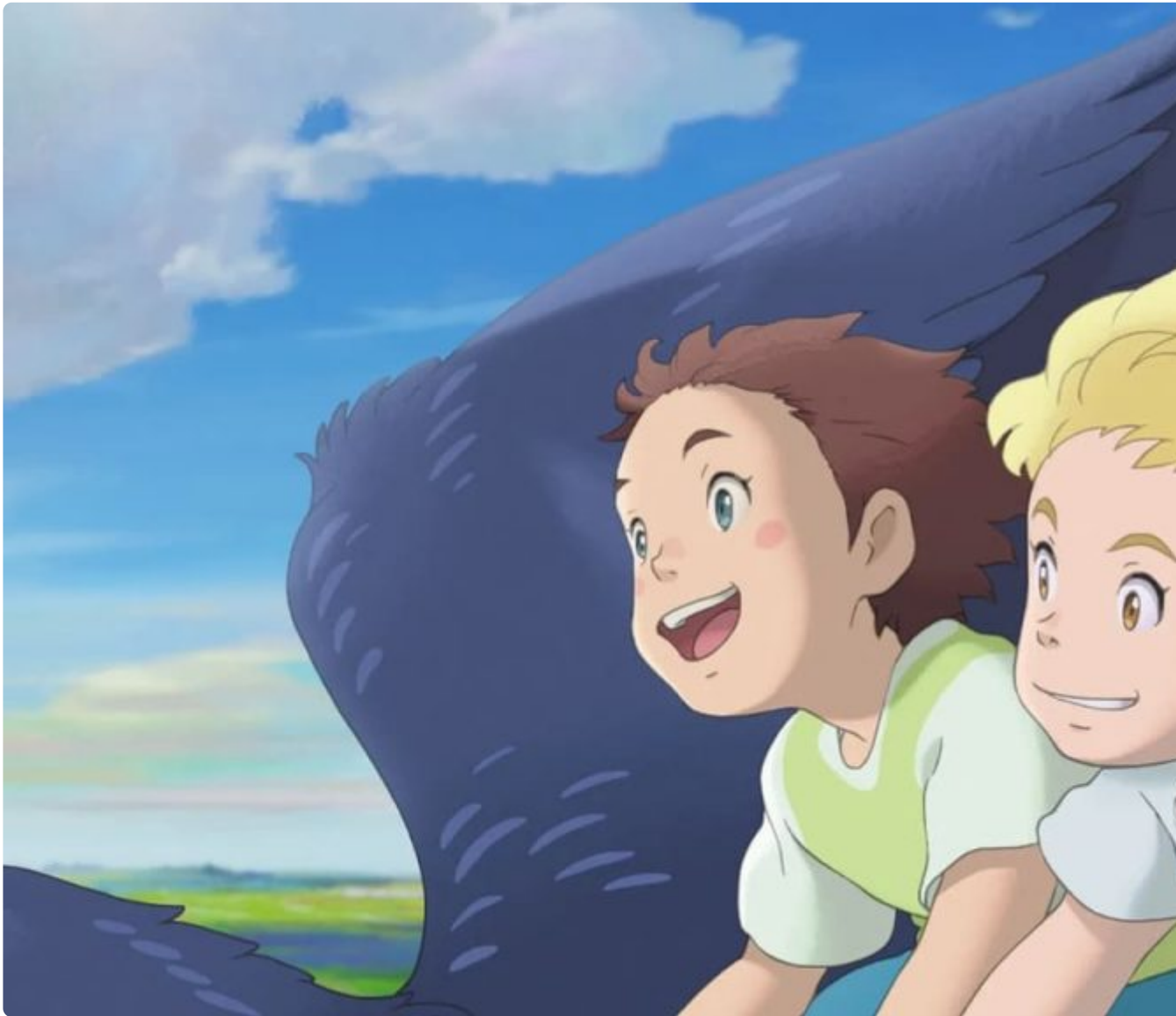


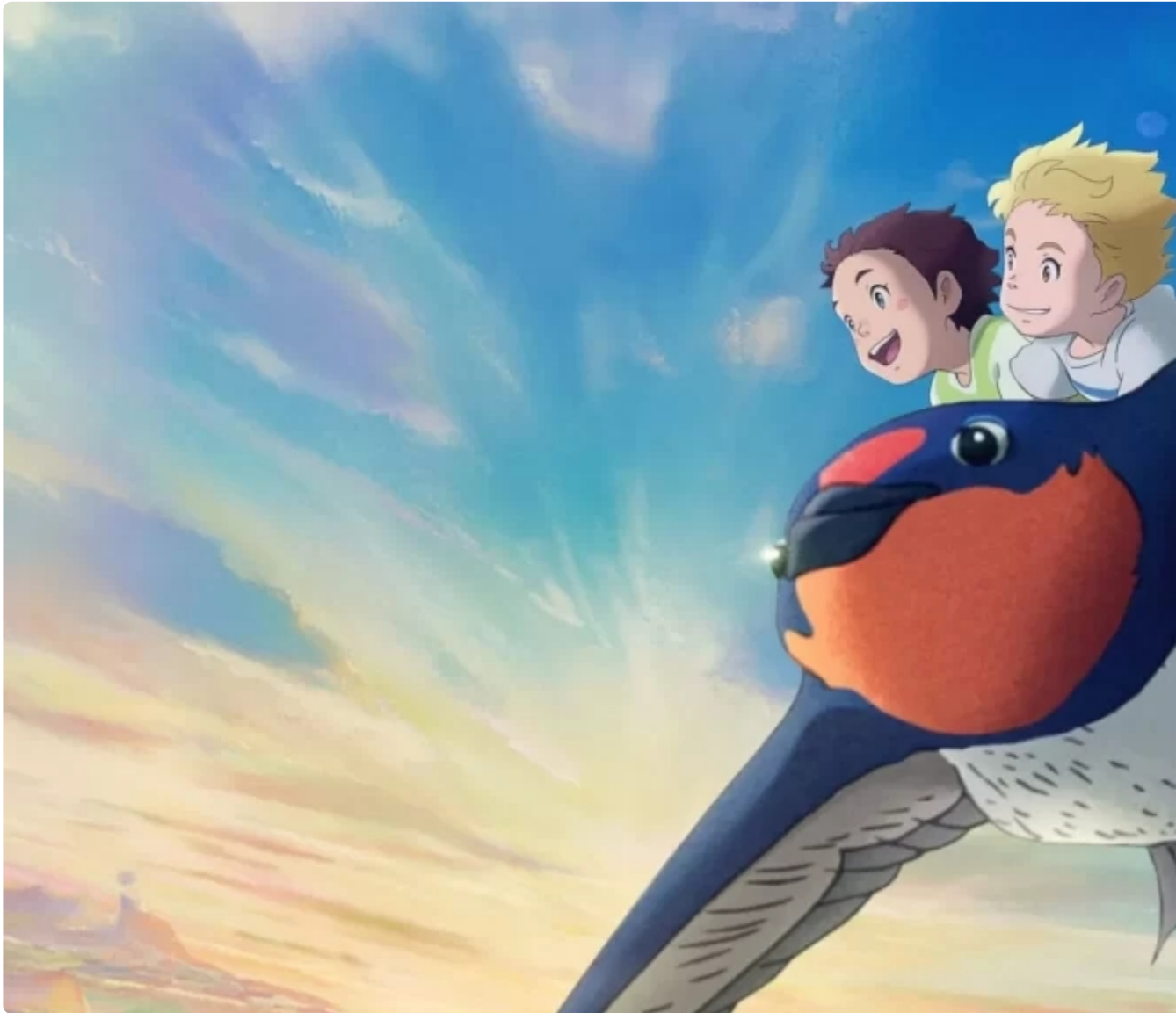
The Imaginary (2024)
