



The Watchers (2024)

Description

Ishana Night Shyamalan's Ambitious Directorial Debut

The Watchers (2024) is a supernatural horror film directed by Ishana Night Shyamalan, marking her directorial debut. The film is based on the book by A.M. Shine and stars Dakota Fanning, Georgina Campbell, Olwen Fou  r  , Oliver Finnegan, Alistair Brammer, and John Lynch. The story follows Mina, a young American woman living in Ireland, who becomes trapped in a forest with mythical creatures that observe her and her companions every night. WATCHERS

Mina (Dakota Fanning) is a young American living in Galway, Ireland. She spends her days working at a pet shop and her nights cosplaying at bars, embodying anyone but herself. When her car breaks down in a dense, directionless forest, Mina sets out in search of help. As night falls, the forest turns menacing, with something seemingly chasing her. She stumbles upon a small bunker where Madeleine (Olwen Fouere) welcomes her inside.

This bunker, referred to as "The Coop," is home to Ciara (Georgina Campbell) and Daniel (Oliver Finnegan). The Coop features three walls and a large one-way window, acting as a mirror for the residents and a display for the forest's creatures, the titular watchers. Every night, the group must line up at the window like shop mannequins and allow themselves to be observed by the watchers. Trapped in the forest for months, their survival—and now Mina's—depends on following a set of strict rules: be in the coop before nightfall and always greet the watchers on time. The day is safe, but the night is perilous, and breaking the rules results in a brutal death.

Shyamalan tackles much with "The Watchers," but the film reveals her limited toolkit. The rich source material offers ample opportunities for worldbuilding, set pieces, and [character development](#), but "The Watchers" falls short in creative vision and depth. The script is riddled with vapid dialogue

and a lack of commitment to the genre, struggling to establish its identity and maturity. Madeleine's warnings about the watchers' violence are frequent but fail to instill genuine fear. The film wavers between kid-friendly horror reminiscent of *The Haunted Mansion* and attempts to draw blood akin to a James Wan classic like *Insidious*. Shyamalan excels more in mystical elements than in macabre, but her execution feels disjointed, making *The Watchers* appear flimsy.

The design of the forest creatures is compelling in the dark, with nighttime sequences of silhouettes and partial details creating tension. However, Shyamalan makes the classic mistake of revealing too much in the light, diminishing the creatures' monstrosity with an overused design. When the watchers approach their final form, they venture into uncanny valley territory—imperfect but effective.

The Watchers explores themes of duplication and voyeurism. From Mina's twin sister to the mimicking parrot she carries and the watchers' lore, the film juggles individuality and Darwinian survival. The Coop serves as a stage, and the group's sole DVD for entertainment is a season of *The Lair of Love*, a parody of *Love Island*. This parallel of an isolated group being watched for others' entertainment is clear, but the thesis remains incomplete. Shyamalan's pen leaves these ideas as hypotheses rather than fully realized thoughts.

The performances in *The Watchers* suffer due to an unrefined script and confusing dialogue. As the characters grapple with the origin of the watchers, even they seem bewildered by their lines. The heavy exposition and direct dialogue leave little room for nuanced acting. Fanning portrays Mina's hollowness well, but falters in moments requiring heightened emotion. Campbell, carving her niche in horror with roles in *Barbarian*, *Black Mirror*, and *Bird Box*, stands out, likely due to her minimal dialogue.

The Watchers struggles to find a balance between lore-heavy exposition, dense dialogue, and a bloated narrative. Shyamalan vacillates between a fairytale and a horror story, and the film's potential gets lost in her indecision. While the film presents interesting ideas, they lack depth, and *The Watchers* fails to solidify its stance. It leaves viewers curious but ultimately unfulfilled, revealing a director who is ambitious but still developing her artistic foundation.
